

## The Gender Debate Submitted by Beverly Dees

In 2022, the Biden administration announced it would expand Title IX protections for LGBTQ students. Title IX, passed in 1972, made it illegal to discriminate against girls or girls' sports teams in public education. The expanded definition of Title IX requires schools to allow access to bathrooms, locker rooms and sports teams to transgender students. The goal was to provide more protection for students against discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity. Schools that do not go along with Biden's amendment risk losing federal funding for their school lunch program. Ohio is one of 22 states suing in federal courts to block this interpretation of Title IX.

In December of 2022, the Ohio Board of Education, by a 10-7 vote, passed a resolution that would reject President Biden's amendment to Title IX. The resolution would require school districts to tell parents when their child "questions their gender identity," wants to be identified by another name or pronoun or other matters related to their gender identity. The resolution also asks the legislature to approve a ban on teaching students in kindergarten through third grade about sexual orientation and gender identity. There was a lot of controversy and some criticism over the decision. School districts were informed of the resolution; however, it is not a law and is unenforceable. O.D.E. states that it is in compliance with federal law.

School boards and superintendents are trying to deal with this issue, with backlash from both sides. Decisions have been made in secret to avoid community opposition. Some have pressed for a political middle ground that will protect students without requiring new rules. Schools like Lakota have single use restrooms available in all their schools; however, a transgender student can still claim discrimination if not allowed to use the gender-preferred restroom. Parents of girls say their daughters don't feel safe with males allowed in the same restroom. Local grievances run through the school's Title IX coordinator, which have procedures in place to handle cases involving sex discrimination. In many people's minds, the issue has not been settled.
